VI. UPDATE ON PARK IMPROVEMENTS

Bennett Howell, P.E., Public Services Director, said the following is a list of parks in Benbrook.

- Robot Park
- Castle Park
- Ball Fields
- Twilight Park
- Rolling Hills Park
- Tennis/Basketball Courts
- Mont Del Park
- Timber Creek Park
- Community Garden

Mr. Howell showed a map of the existing hike and bike trails in Benbrook and said there are plans to add others. Some will be funded by developers and some by the City.

The Parks Department is in the process of replacing the wooden light poles in Dutch Branch Park with metal poles.

Mr. Howell said it is thought that all the parks department does is landscape and maintenance but they also play a large part in special city events such as:

- Wounded Warrior/Fallen Hero Event
- Heritage Fest
- Winter Wonderland
- City Hall Christmas Lights
- Household Hazardous Waste/Shredding/E-Waste
- Relay for Life

The Parks Department is responsible for trash removal, mowing and maintaining over 125 acres in the city. The department has built and maintains the pump house at Dutch Branch Park, the Community Garden and storage building, and irrigation and silt removal at the Dutch Branch Park pond. Mr. Howell said the Parks Department has also designed, built and maintains all the park pavilion covers and the pipe rail fence along Benbrook Boulevard/U.S. Highway 377. He said that with all the work that the department does in-house saves the tax payers money.

Mr. Howell said the department is made up of only eight, very talented employees that try their best to provide excellent services in all that they do and in any and all conditions. They include carpenters, plumbers, electricians and welders that do excellent work for the city.
